Paul N. Langevin, DO, DIMM, MPH is an osteopathic physician in Wyoming and Montana. A 2001 graduate of Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic Medicine, he completed residencies in Aerospace and Occupational Medicine at the Naval Aerospace Medical Institute and earned a Master of Public Health from the University of West Florida. He also holds diplomas in Contemporary Medical Acupuncture from McMaster University and Mountain Medicine. Dr. Langevin serves as Assistant Professor of Osteopathic Clinical Sciences at Rocky Vista University

Montana College of Osteopathic Medicine and maintains a private osteopathic practice in Star Valley, Wyoming. A retired Naval Medical Officer who held positions as Senior Medical Officer aboard the USS Nimitz and with Marine units in austere environments. An active member of the American Academy of Osteopathy, he integrates osteopathic manipulative medicine with contemporary medical acupuncture, including auricular techniques, into both patient care and medical education.

Course Description

This hands-on course equips osteopathic physicians with practical skills in auricular acupuncture (AA). Participants will explore the history of AA and neuroanatomy of the ear, learn to accurately identify active points through palpation, and master key protocols including Battlefield Acupuncture (BFA) and Acute Trauma Protocol (ATP). Emphasis is placed on safe, effective integration of this efficient, drug-free modality into clinical practice for pain, anxiety, TBI, and other common conditions. Through demonstration and partner practice, attendees will gain confidence using auricular therapy to complement osteopathic manipulative medicine in office, ER, pre-op, and austere environments.

Course Objectives

To enable the Osteopathic Physician to effectively integrate auricular acupuncture/auricular therapy into their clinical practice. To improve patient outcomes through targeted, drug-free interventions for common conditions.
