Sequencing: Locating and Treating Shock in the Body (Intermediate Course)

When a patient comes to see you that has already been to see more than one other qualified practitioner, they are likely telling you that their body is in shock. This shock is different than hypovolemic, neurogenic or septic. This shock restricts movement in planes of motion (and thus affects the whole body). This shock prevents treatments (even osteopathic ones) from working. Learn how to identify the five different types of shock (including the one that Dr. Fulford described), which planes of motion that they hinder and how to rapidly treat them and restore movement in the body. Previous knowledge of the sequencing method of screening the patient is required.

Course Goals & Objectives

- Dural Shock (flexion/extension restriction)
- Fulford's Shock (side bending restriction)
- Axial Shock (rotation restriction).
- Midline Shock (translation restriction).
- Abdominal Shock (lumbar restriction).

At the conclusion of the course, the student can demonstrate more than one diagnostic approach to locate the types of shock.

Prerequisite

As an intermediate course, anyone who has either taken a sequencing course or who has been taught sequencing at their COM can attend. This course is open to students, physicians, dentists and any other allied health professional that the AAO is allowed to teach. Any physician specialty is allowed to attend.
